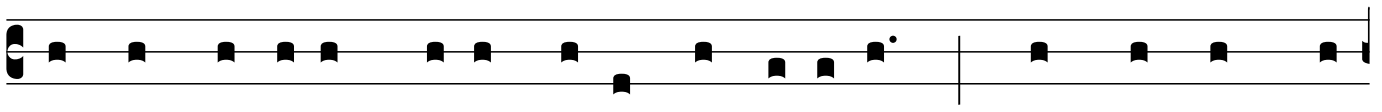
we will be changed. For this per-ishable bod-y must put on imper-ishabil-ity,



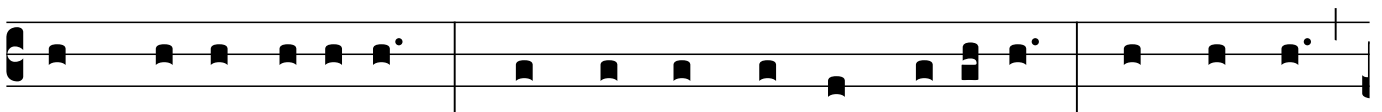

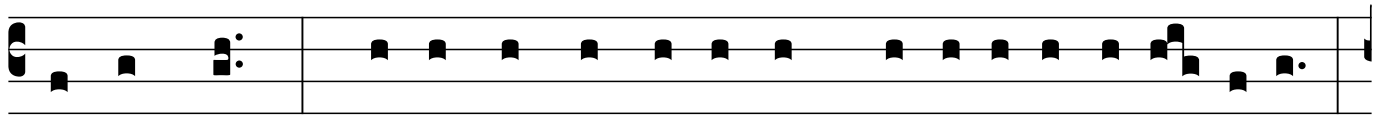
bod-y puts on imper-ishabil-ity and this mortal bod-y puts on immortal-i-



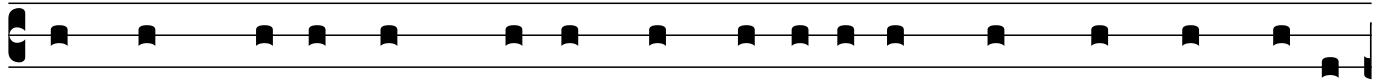
ty, then the say-ing that is writ-ten will be ful-filled: “Death has been swal-



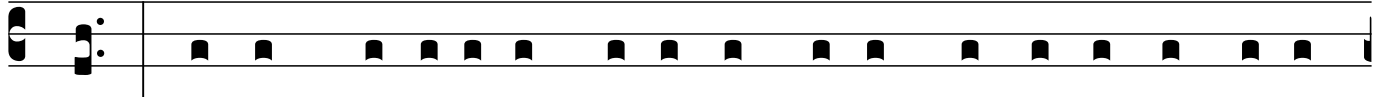
lowed up in victo-ry.” “Where, O death, is your victo-ry? Where, O death,



is your sting?" The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law.



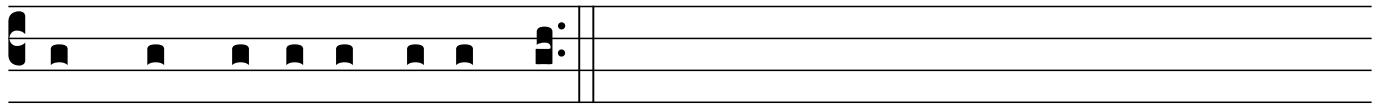
But thanks be to God, who gives us the victo-ry through our Lord Je-sus
