
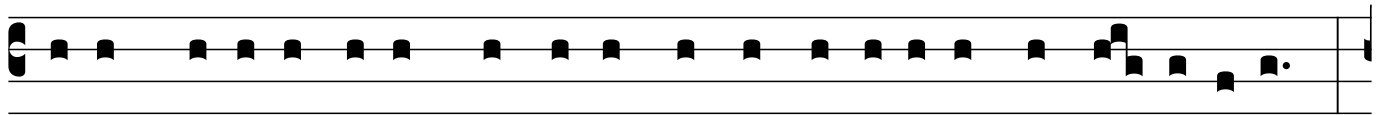

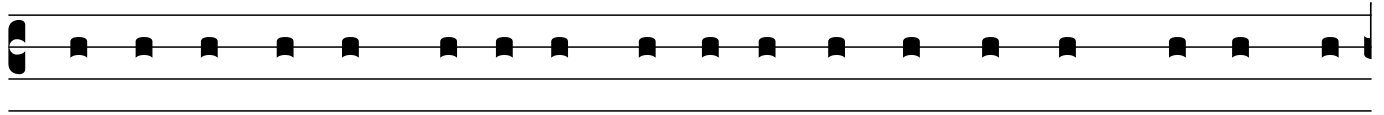
Epiphany (Day)



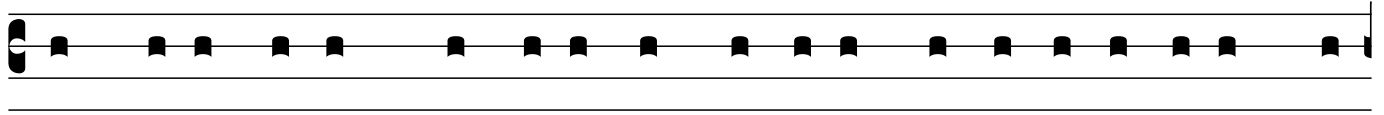

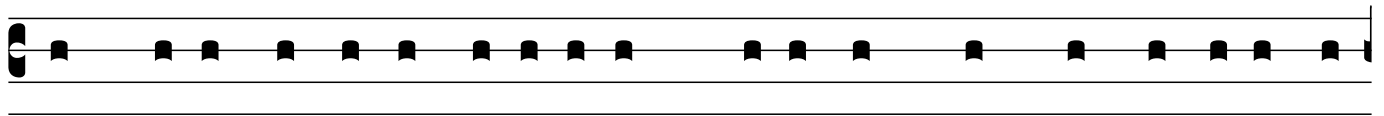
We are witnesses to all that he did both in Ju-de- a and in Je- ru-sa-lem.



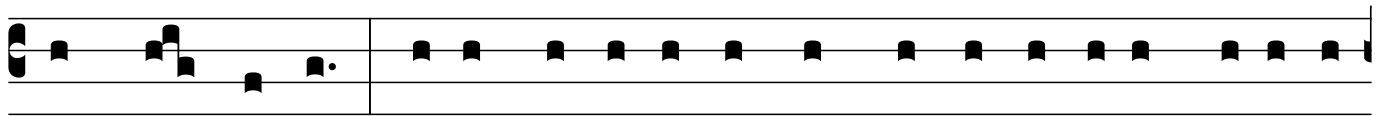
They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, but God raised him on the



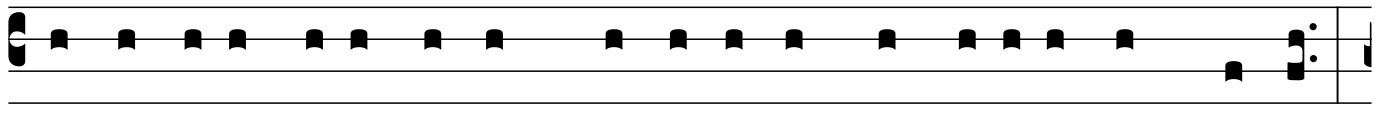
third day and al-lowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who



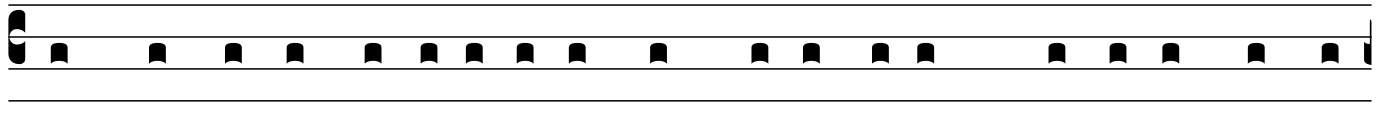
were cho-sen by God as witnesses and who ate and drank with him after he



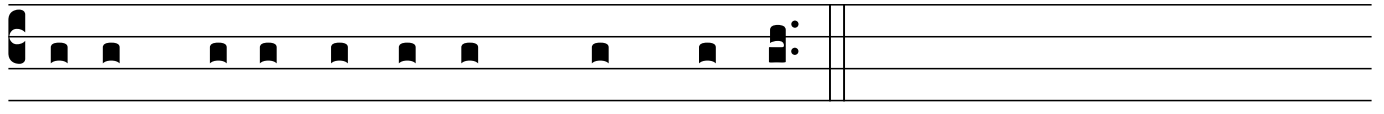
rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to tes-ti-
