
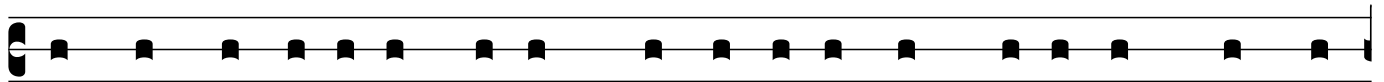


1 Corinthians 10:1-13

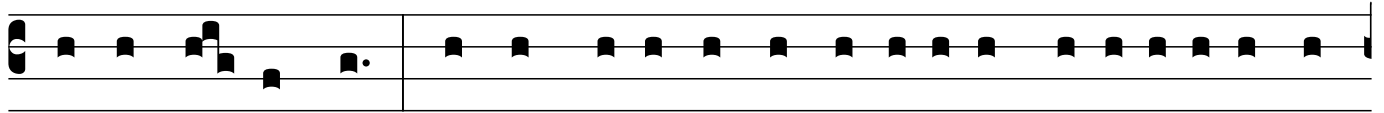

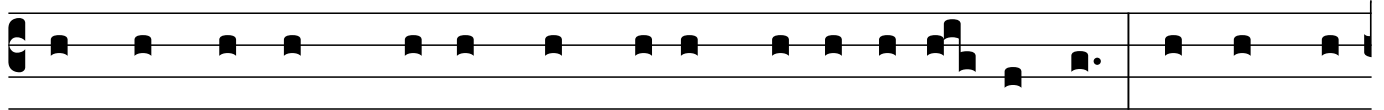
I do not want you to be igno-rant, brothers and sis-ters, that our
ancestors were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea, and all

spir-it-u- al food, and all drank the same spir-it-u- al drink. For they drank
from the spir-it-u- al rock that fol-lowed them, and the rock was Christ.
Nev-erthe-less, God was not pleased with most of them, and they were struck
down in the wilderness. Now these things occurred as ex-amples for us, so
that we might not de-sire e-vil as they did. Do not be-come i-dol-a-ters as some



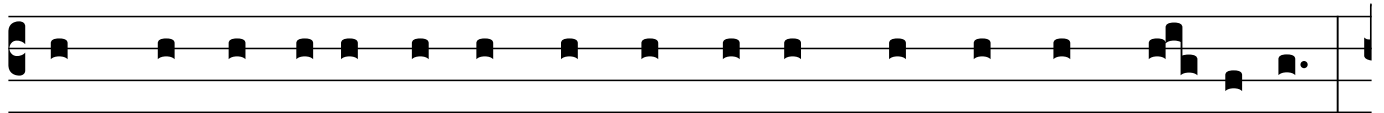
of them did, as it is writ-ten, "The people sat down to eat and drink, and



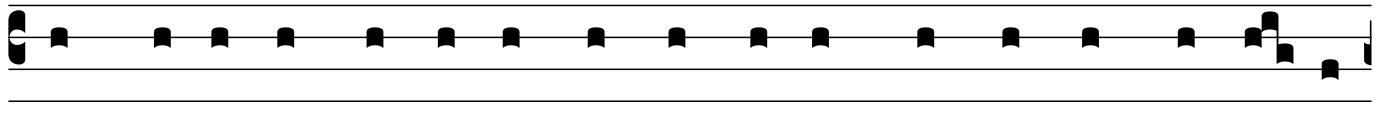
they rose up to play." We must not engage in sex-u- al immo-ral-i-ty, as some



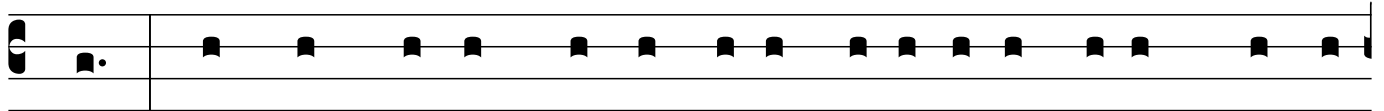
of them did, and twenty-three thousand fell in a sin-gle day. We must not



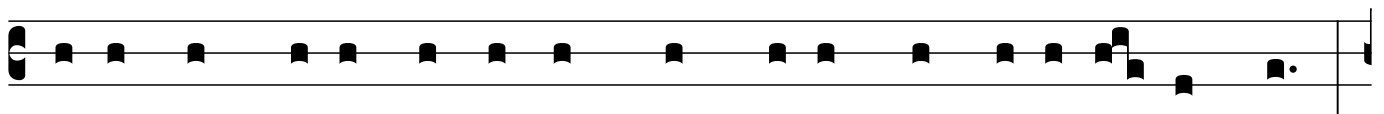
put Christ to the test, as some of them did, and were destroyed by ser-pents.



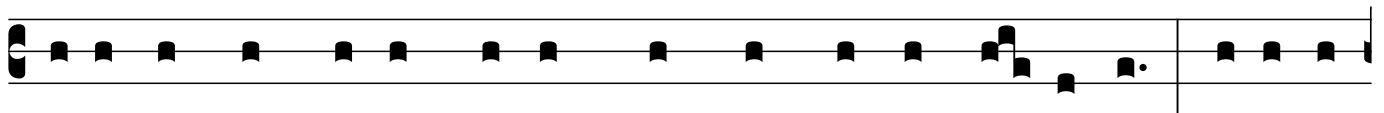
And do not complain, as some of them did, and were destroyed by the de-



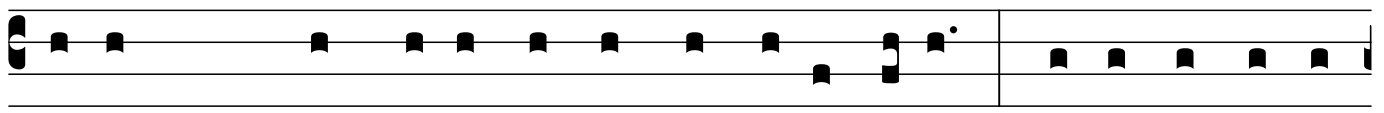
stroyer. These things happened to them to serve as an ex-ample, and they were
