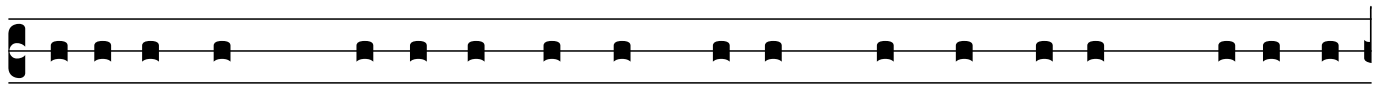
hen the day of Pente-cost had come, they were all to-gether in



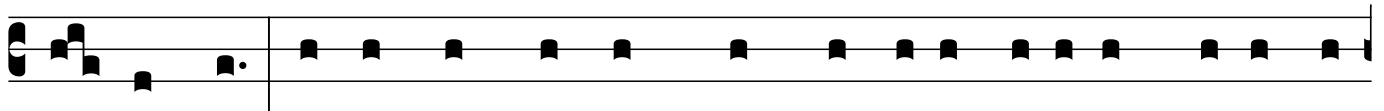
one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of



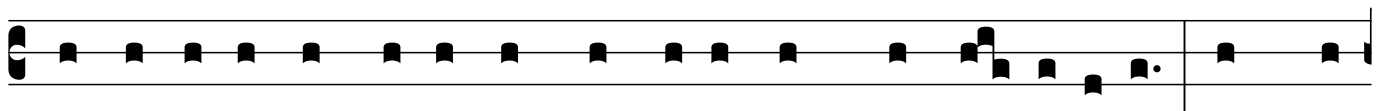
a vi- o-lent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sit-ting.



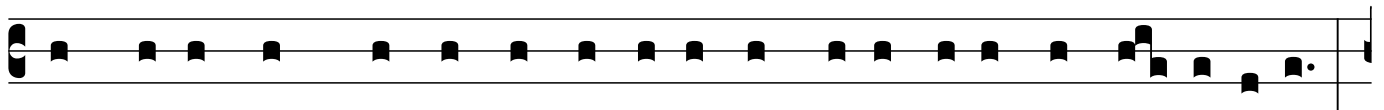
Di-vid-ed tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on



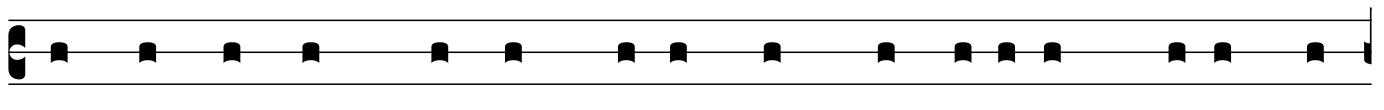
each of them. All of them were filled with the Ho-ly Spir- it and be-gan to



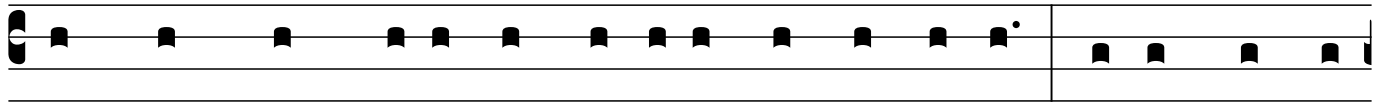
speak in other languag-es, as the Spir- it gave them a- bil- i-ty. Now there



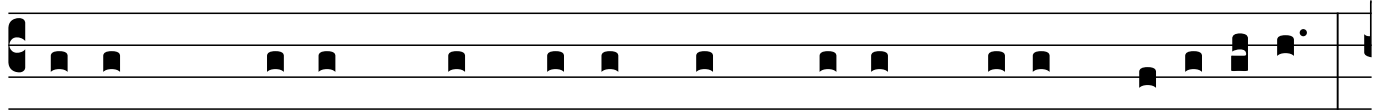
were devout Jews from every people under heaven liv-ing in Je- ru-sa-lem.



And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each



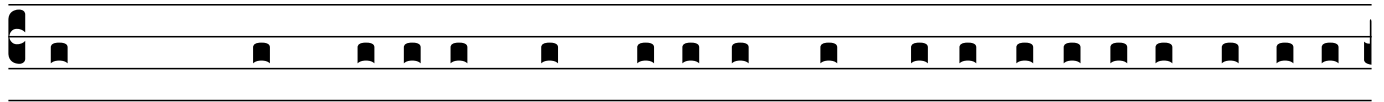
one heard them speaking in the na-tive language of each. Amazed and a-

And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own na-tive language?



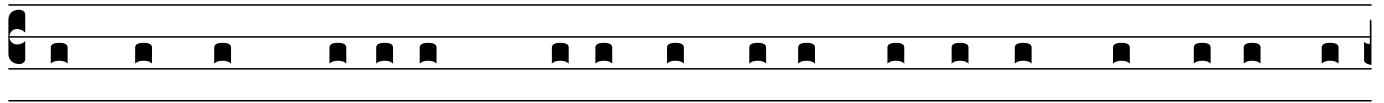
Parthians, Medes, E-lamites, and res-i-dents of Mes-o-po-tami- a, Ju-de- a



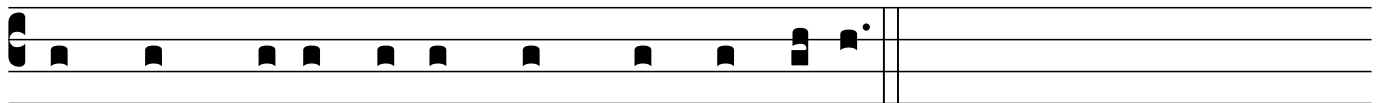
and Cappa-do-ci- a, Pontus and Asia, Phryg-i- a and Pamphyl-i- a, E-gypt
