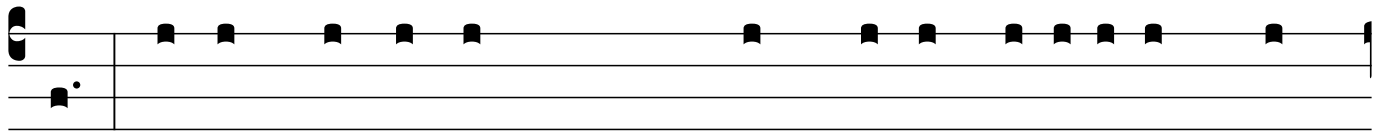
the cross.” He stretched out his hands to an unbe-liev-ing and re-bellious peo-



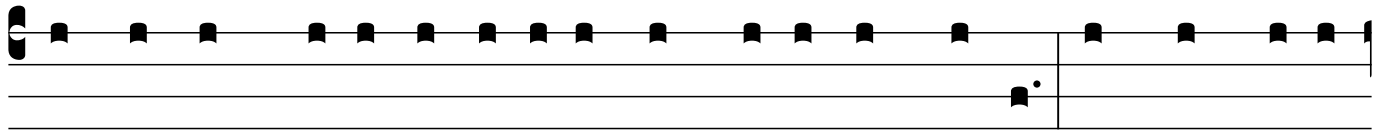
ple. If one is just who lives by faith, one who does not have faith is unright-



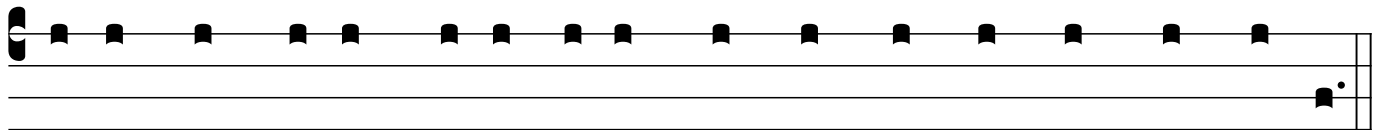
eous. Therefore when he says “unrighteousness,” understand that it is unbe-
