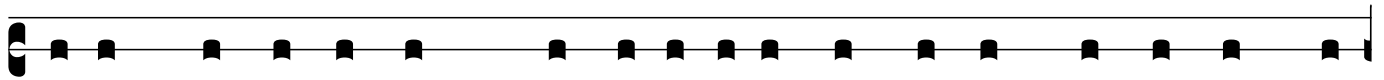
I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, on the basis of God's



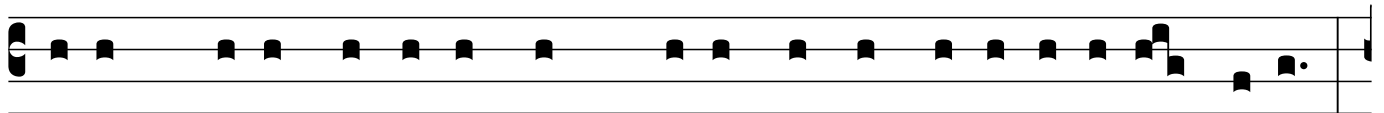
mercy, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable



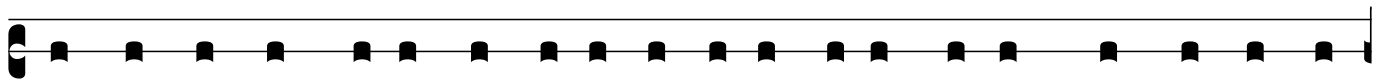

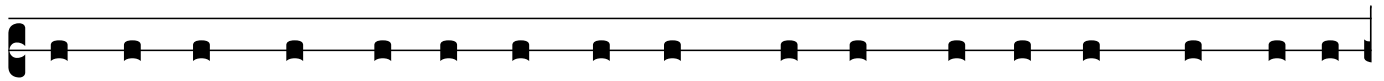

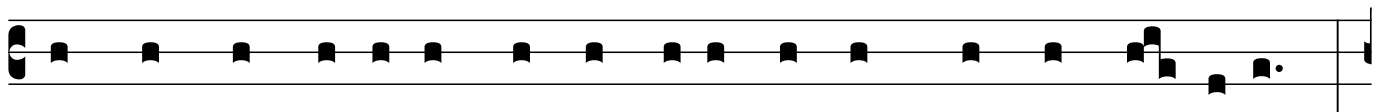
discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect.



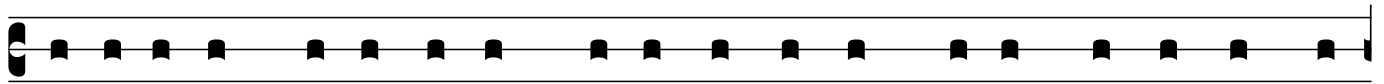
For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think



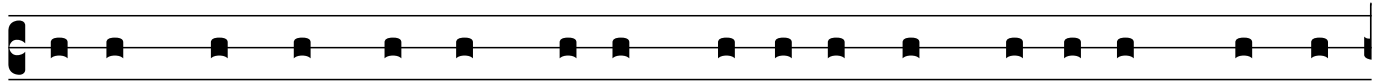

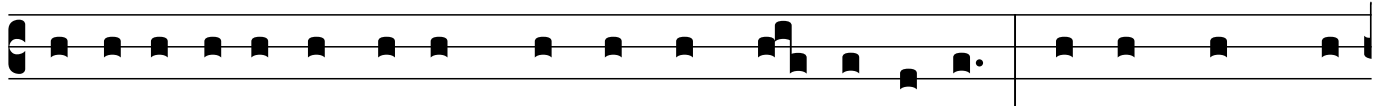
judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned.



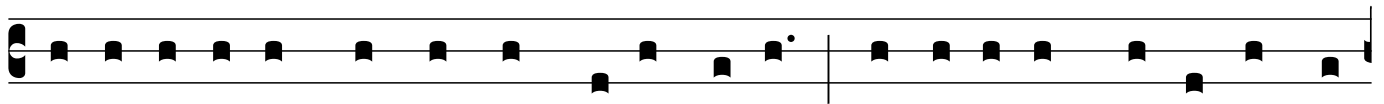
For as in one bod-y we have man-y members and not all the members have



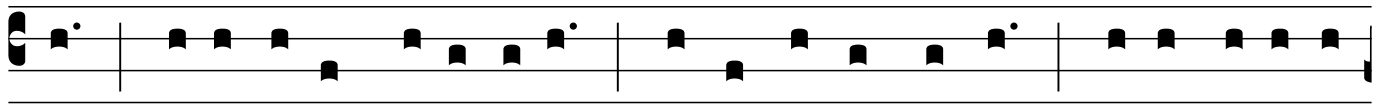
the same function, so we, who are man-y, are one bod-y in Christ, and



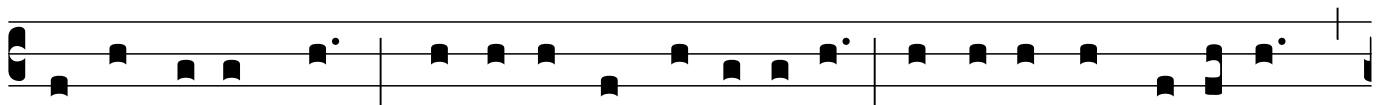
indi-vid-u- al-ly we are members one of an-other. We have gifts that



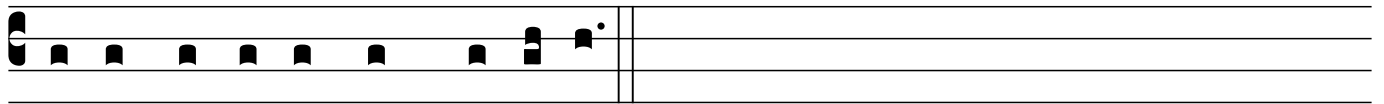
dif-fer according to the grace giv-en to us: prophe-cy, in pro-portion to
