


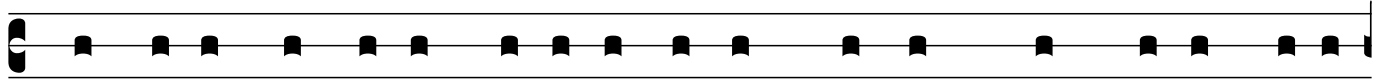
Ephesians 2:1-10

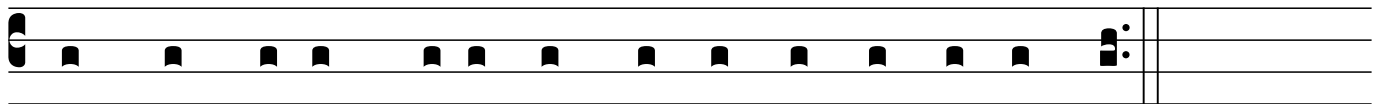
grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own do- ing;
