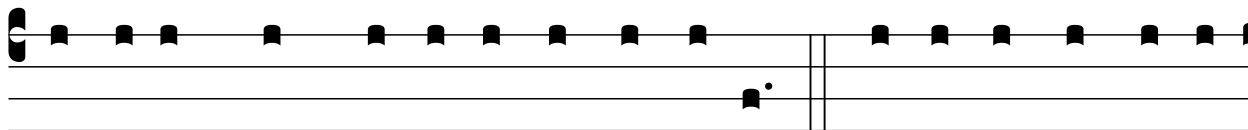

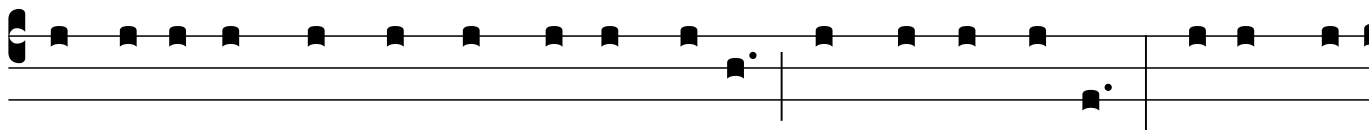

Reading from the Let-ter to the Hebrews. We do not have a high



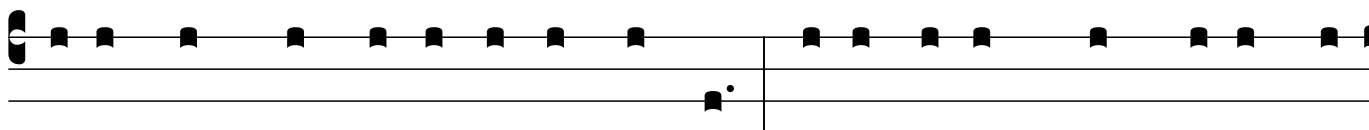
priest who is un-able to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in



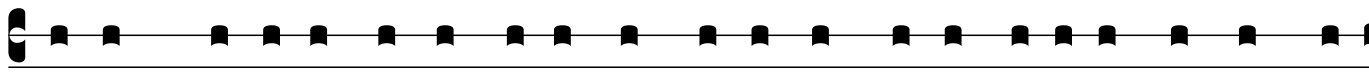
every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sinning. Let us then



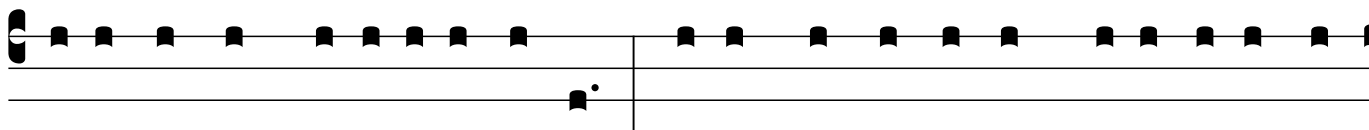
with confi-dence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may re-ceive mer-



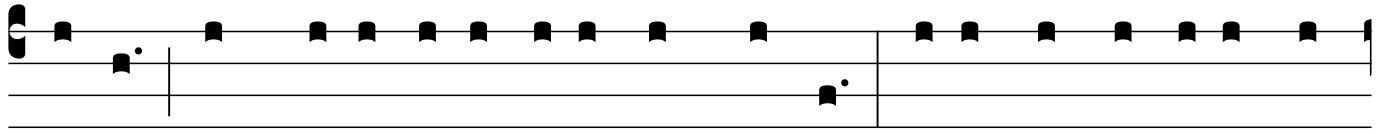
cy and find grace to help in time of need. For every high priest cho-sen from



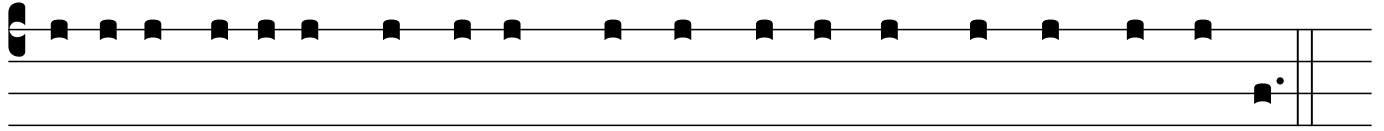
among men is appointed to act on be-half of men in re-lation to God, to
