


I consid-er that the suffer-ings of this pre-sent time are not worth com-




par-ing with the glo-ry about to be revealed to us. For the cre-ation waits



with eager longing for the reveal-ing of the children of God, for the cre-ation




was subjected to fu-til-i-ty, not of its own will, but by the will of the one




who subjected it, in hope that the cre-ation it-self will be set free from its en-




slavement to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glo-ry of the children




of God. We know that the whole cre-ation has been groaning to-gether as it




suffers to-gether the pains of la-bor, and not only the cre-ation, but we our-




selves, who have the first fruits of the Spir-it, groan inwardly while we wait
