




How sweet, O Lord, are your words to my taste.




97. Oh, how I love your law! all the *day* long it is in my mind.




98. Your commandment has made me wiser than my en-e-mies, and it is al-ways with me. **Refrain**



101. I re-strain my feet from ev-'ry e-vil way, that I may keep your word.




102. I do *not* shrink from your judg-ments, because you your-self have taught me. **Refrain**



103. How sweet are your words to my taste! they are sweeter than hon-ey to my mouth.


