


**Rogation Procession 3**

Mode 7 **Refrain**






1. Bless the Lord, O my soul: O Lord my *God*, how excellent is your greatness,

wa-ters a - bove; you make the clouds your chariot; you ride on the wings of the wind.




4. You make the winds your mes-sen - gers and flames of fire your ser - vants. **Refrain**



5. You have set the earth up-on its foun-da-tions, so that it never shall move at an - y time.



6. You covered it with the Deep as with a man-tle; the waters *stood* higher than the moun-tains. **Refrain**



7. At your re-buke they fled; at the voice of your thunder they has - tened a - way.



8. They went up into the hills and down to the val-leys be-neath, to the places you had ap-point-ed for them.



9. You set the limits that they should not pass; they shall not *again* cov - er the earth. **Refrain**

10. You send the *springs* in - to the val-leys; they flow be - tween the moun-tains.

11. All the beasts of the *field* drink their fill from them, and the *wild* ass-es quench their thirst.

12. Beside them the birds of the air make their nests and sing a - mong the branch - es. **Refrain**

13. You wa - ter the mountains from your dwell-ling on high; the earth is fully satisfied by the fruit of your works. 14. You make *grass* grow for flocks and herds and plants to serve man - kind; **Refrain** 15. That they may *bring forth* food from the earth, and wine to glad - den our hearts, 16. Oil to make a cheer - ful coun - te - nance, and bread to strength - en the heart. **Refrain** 17. The trees of the Lord are full of sap, the cedars of Lebanon which he plant - ed, 18. In which the birds build their nests, and in whose tops the *stork* makes his dwell - ing. **Refrain** 19. The high hills are a refuge for the moun-tain goats, and the stony cliffs for the rock bad - gers.

20. You appointed the moon to mark the sea-sons, and the *sun* knows the time of its set-ting. **Refrain**

21. You make darkness that it may be night, in *which* all the beasts of the for - est prowl.

22. The lions *roar* af - ter their prey and seek their food from God.

23. The *sun* rises, and they slip a - way and lay themselves down in their dens.

24. *Man* goes forth to his work and to his labor un - til the eve - ning. **Refrain**

25. O Lord, how man - i - fold are your works! in wisdom you have made them all;  
the earth is full of your crea - tures. 26. Yonder is the great and *wide* sea  
with its living things too man - y to num - ber, crea - tures both small and great.

27. There move the ships, and there is that Lev - i - a - than, which you have  
made for the sport of it. **Refrain** 28. All of them look to you,  
to give them their food in due sea - son. 29. You give it to them; they gath - er it;  
you open your *hand*, and they are filled with good things. **Refrain**

30. You hide your face, and they are ter - ri - fied; you take away their breath,  
and they die and re - turn to their dust. 31. You *send* forth your Spirit, and they are cre - a - ted;
