My soul is a - thirst for God, a - thirst for the liv - ing God.




1. As the *deer* longs for the wa - ter - brooks, so longs my soul for you, O God.



2. My soul is athirst for God, athirst for the liv - ing God; when shall I come to appear before the pres - ence of God? **Refrain**




3. My tears have been my *food* day and night, while *all day* long they say to me, "Where now is your God?"




4. I pour out my soul when I think on *these things*: how I went with the multitude and led them in - to the house of God,

1. God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trou-ble.

2. Therefore we will *not fear* though the earth be moved, and though the mountains be toppled into the depths of the sea; 3. Though its waters rage and foam, and though the mountains tremble at its tu-mult. **Refrain** 5. There is a river whose *streams make* glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High.

1. Lord, you have been our ref - uge from one generation to an oth - er.


2. Before the mountains were *brought forth* or the land and the earth were born,

5. You sweep us a - way like a dream; we fade away sud-den-ly like the grass.


6. In the morning it is green and flour-ish-es; in the evening is *dried* up and with-ered. **Refrain**

9. When you are angry, all our days are gone; we bring our years to an end like a sigh.




10. The span of our life is seventy years, perhaps in *strength* e - ven eigh - ty;



yet the sum of them is but labor and sorrow, for they pass away quick-ly and we are gone. **Refrain**




11. Who re - gards the pow-er of your wrath? *who* rightly fears your in - dig - na - tion?

4. Behold, he who *keeps watch* over Is - ra - el shall neither slum-ber nor sleep; **Refrain**




5. The Lord *himself* watches o - ver you; the Lord is your shade at your right hand,

from *this time* forth for ev - er - more. **Refrain.**






Out of the depths have I called to you, O Lord.




1. Out of the depths have I called to you, O Lord; *Lord*, hear my voice;



let your ears consider well the voice of my sup - pli - ca - tion. **Refrain**




2. If you, Lord, were to note what is done a - miss, O Lord, who could stand?



3. For there is forgiveness with you; therefore you shall be feared. **Refrain**




4. I wait for the Lord, my *soul* waits for him; in *his* word is my hope.




5. My *soul* waits for the Lord, more than watchmen for the morn - ing,






2. He makes me *lie* down in green pas - tures and leads me be-side still wa - ters. **Refrain**




3. He re - vives my soul and guides me *along right* pathways for his Name's sake.



4. Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I shall fear no e - vil;




for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they com - fort me. **Refrain**

17. What if I had not believed that I should see the goodness of the Lord




