


Palm Sunday: Liturgy of the Palms Years A, B, C


Psalm 118: 1-2, 19-29

Antiphon¹




Ho - san - na in the high - est; bless - ed is he who comes in the
Name of the Lord; ho - san - na in the high - est.


The italicized portion of the antiphon is to be repeated as a refrain after each verse of the psalm.




1. Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his mercy endures for ev - er. **Refrain**




2. Let Is - rael now proclaim, "His mercy endures for ev - er." **Refrain**




19. Op - en for me the gates of righteousness; I will enter them; I will offer thanks




to the Lord. **Refrain** 20. "This is the gate of the Lord; he who is righteous may en - ter." **Refrain**


25. Ho - san - na, Lord, hosanna! Lord, send us now suc - cess. **Refrain**




26. Bless-ed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; we bless you from the house




of the Lord. **Refrain** 27. God is the Lord; he has shined upon us;






Psalm 31: 9-16

Mode 2 **Refrain**




Have mer - cy on me, O God.

9. Have mer-cy on me, O Lord, for I am in trou-ble; my eye is consumed with sorrow,
and also my throat and my bel - ly. 10. For my life is wasted with grief,
and my years with sigh - ing; my *strength* fails me because of affliction,
and my bones are con-sumed. **Refrain** 11. I have become a reproach to all my enemies
and even to my neighbors, a dismay to those of my ac-quain-tance; when they see me
in the *street* they a - void me. 12. I am forgotten like a dead *man*, out of mind;
I am as useless as a brok-en pot. **Refrain** 13. For I have heard the whispering of the crowd;
fear is all a-round; they put their heads together against me; they plot to take my life.
14. But as for *me*, I have trusted in you, O Lord. I have *said*, "You are my God. **Refrain**
15. My times are in your hand; rescue me from the hand of my enemies,



and from those who per - se - cute me. 16. Make your face to shine upon your ser - vant,



and in your loving - kind - ness save me." **Refrain**

of the nations shall bow be - fore him. 27. For kingship belongs to the Lord;




he *rules* over the na-tions. 28. To him *alone* all who sleep in the *earth* bow down in wor-ship;

my descendants shall serve him; they shall be known as the Lord's for ev - er.




30. They shall come and *make* known to a people yet un - born the saving deeds


