1. Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, and his mercy endures for ever.




2. Let *all those* whom the Lord has redeemed proclaim that he redeemed them




from the hand of the foe. 3. He gathered from out of the lands;




from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south. **Refrain**




17. Some were fools and took to rebellious ways; they were afflicted



because of their sins. 18. They abhorred *all* manner of food




and *drew* near to death's door. **Refrain** 19. Then they




cried to the Lord in their trouble, and he delivered them from their distress.

and tell of his acts with shouts of joy. **Refrain**


Tract: Psalm 125: 1-4 (5)




1. Those who trust in the Lord are like Mount Zi - on, which cannot

so does the Lord *stand* round about his people, from *this time* forth for ev - er - more.




3. The scepter of the wicked shall *not hold sway* over the land allotted to the just,

to those who are good and to those who are true of heart.




5. As for those who turn aside to crooked ways, the Lord will lead them
