



Celebration for a Home




The elder to the be-lov-ed Ga-ius, whom I love in truth. Be-lov-ed,

they have tes-ti-fied to your love be-fore the church. Be-lov-ed, do not im-i-




tate what is e-vil, but im-i-tate what is good. Who- ev-er does good is




from God; who- ev-er does e-vil has not seen God. I have much to write to
