


Ending of a Pastoral Relationship 6






thing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your




requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses




all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Je-sus.




Fi-nal-ly, brothers and sis-ters, what-ev-er is true, what-ev-er is hon-or-able,




what-ev-er is just, what-ev-er is pure, what-ev-er is pleas-ing, what-ev-er is




commendable, if there is an-y excel-lence and if there is an-ything worthy of




praise, think about these things. As for the things that you have learned and




re-ceived and heard and no-ticed in me, do them, and the God of peace will
