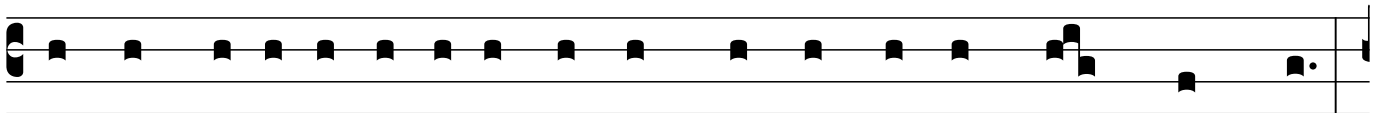
Be-lov-ed, let us love one an-*o*ther, be-*c*ause love is from God; every- one



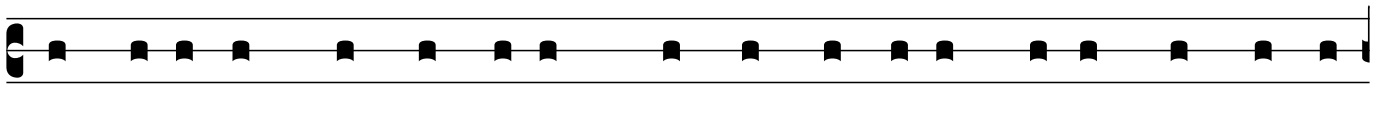
who loves is born of God and knows God. Who- *e*-*v*-er does not love does not



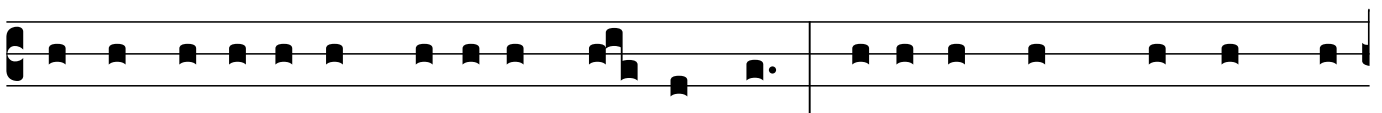
know God, for God is love. God's love was revealed among us in this way:



God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him.



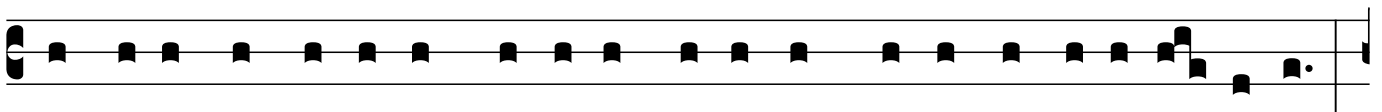
In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son



to be the a-*t*-on-ing sacri-*f*-ice for our sins. Be-lov-ed, since God loved us



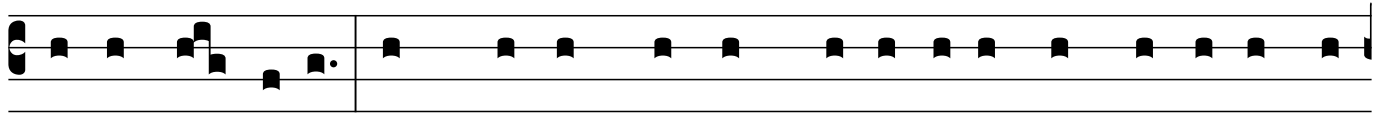
so much, we also ought to love one an-*o*ther. No one has *e*-*v*-er seen God;



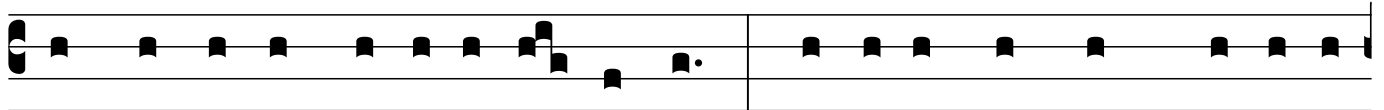
if we love one an-*o*ther, God a-*b*-ides in us, and his love is perfected in us.



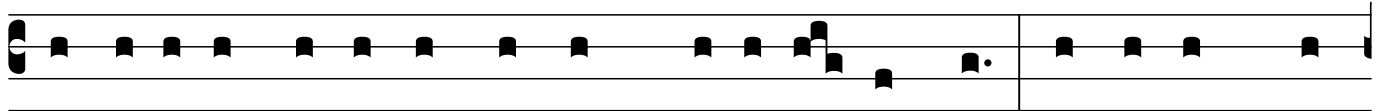
By this we know that we a-bide in him and he in us, because he has giv-en



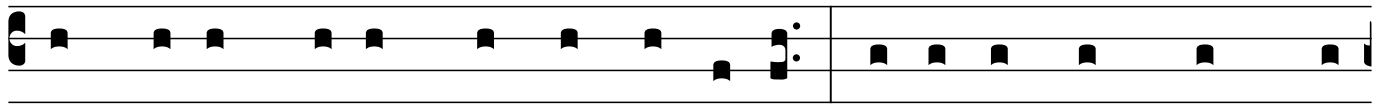
us of his Spir-it. And we have seen and do tes-ti-fy that the Father has



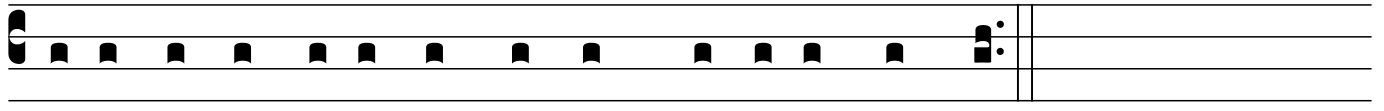
sent his Son as the Savior of the world. God a-bides in those who confess
