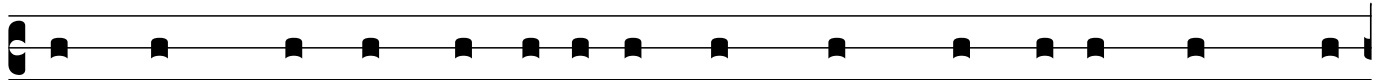
I mean, brothers and sis-ters, the appointed time has grown short;



from now on, let e-ven those who have wives be as though they had none, and



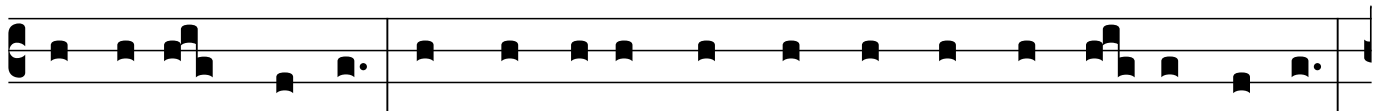

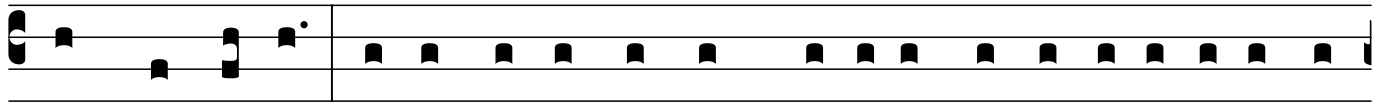
ests are di-vid-ed. And the unmarried woman and the virgin are anxious a-



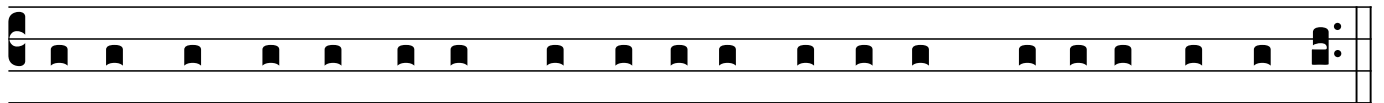
bout the affairs of the Lord, so that they may be ho-ly in bod-y and spir-it,
